FISHING

With 19 fishable lakes and over 30 miles of pristine stream, Vermejo is a world-class fishing destination and fly fishing lodge, where anglers have flocked for over a century.

To fish on your own, just grab a map and gear directly from our fish house and you're ready for a day on the water. If moving water is your game, walk the river banks and sight cast to our rare, native Rio Grande Cutthroat Trout, which were almost extinct prior to our restoration project. Our streams provide a casting adventure across varying terrain, from the meandering waters in

the High Country, to the iconic setting of the Vermejo River. Guests will often encounter wildlife such as bison, bears, and bald eagles while fishing and enjoying the incredible views of Vermejo mountain peaks.

If the serenity of a glassy lake is calling, you can cast from one of our many boats in lakes stocked with rainbow trout, browns, and brookies. You may also schedule a private guide to help you find the best water and teach you the finer points of fly selection and casting. The fishing options at Vermejo are endless.



ICE FISHING

Fishing at Vermejo is a one-of-a-kind adventure, but frosty weather adds a whole new twist to the sport.

One of our expert guides will help you choose a frozen lake, drill a hole in the ice and cast a line. You'll be able to see your line spiraling down to the fishes' normally hidden life under water.

Pulling a cold slippery fish out of a frozen lake is something you have to try to understand just how much fun it can be!

ADAMS LAKE SELF-GUIDED HIKE

Distance: 2.6 miles

Ascent/Descent: 200 ft.

Drive Time: 30 minutes

Hiking Time: 60-90 minutes

Skill-Level: Beginner - Intermediate

Price: Included, Self-guided

Season: All-seasons, provided roads are passable

Attire: Layered clothing, hiking boots or tennis shoes

Don't forget: sunscreen, sunglasses, hat, chapstick

Meander around Adams Lake with or without a guide while taking in spectacular views of sweeping vistas and the lake itself. This gentle hike is the perfect addition to a few hours of fishing or boating, and a picnic lunch at the Adams Lake gazebo.





RIVER TRAIL SELF-GUIDED HIKE

A beautiful trail for a leisurely stroll, a heart-pounding strength and cardiovascular workout, or anything in between. The fitness trail is a perfect place to spend an hour or two in nature without venturing far from Headquarters. There are five obstacles along the way to test your skills, as well as a bench overlooking the river for a break or snack. The trailhead is just north of the lawn in front of Turner House.

GAZEBO TRAIL – SELF-GUIDED HIKE

A quick hike up to the gazebo is an invigorating way to spend a spare hour while getting your heart pumping and taking in a gorgeous view.

Built in the early 1900s, William Bartlett used to have musicians perform for guests from this vantage point with great acoustics. This short, but steep hike is a perfect way to start the day, reinvigorate after a nap, or watch the sunset.

The Nature Trail is a perfect place to create your own hike, wandering through the environment without a big climb. You can make the hike as long or as short as you please. Just turn around when you decide you've gone halfway. Be sure to look for wildflowers, a variety of pine trees, and listen for some of over 300 species of birds on Vermejo.



SECRET RAIN CANYON LOOP

The Rain Canyon Loop begins on the Nature Trail and then takes you back into a hidden canyon that sometimes holds a trickle of water and leads to a dazzling viewpoint that overlooks Butler Flats. Towering rock walls and abundant flora and fossils make you feel like you are truly in the "backcountry" when you are really just a short walk from headquarters. Don't miss this chance to visit a beautiful and secluded place on Vermejo.



RADIO TOWER GUIDED HIKE VIA REED CANYON OR FOSSIL CANYON

Radio Tower is one of the most spectacular viewpoints near Headquarters. You'll get a bird's-eye view of the Lodge and surrounding area, as well as purple mountains in the distance that mark the boundaries of Vermejo. You have a choice of two routes: Reed Canyon which is slightly shorter (6.10 miles round-trip, 1004 ft. elevation gain) or Fossil Canyon for a route that's just a little longer (8.6 miles, 1076 ft.). A shorter option is to just enjoy the many treasures in the canyons, choosing your own turnaround point. Keep an eye out for fossils of ancient sea creatures and plants, as well as wildlife or shed antlers along the way.



ASH MOUNTAIN GUIDED HIKE

Ash Mountain is one of the most easily recognized on Vermejo with its grey colored peak. Witness those grey boulders up close with the Ash Mountain hike. There's more to it than meets the eye.

The hike begins in a meadow just below 10,400 ft. that is filled with mountain iris and wildflowers in early summer. A gradual incline takes you up 500 ft. in elevation through mixed conifer forest and then opens into Vermejo's stunning Elk Meadows, named for the elk who frequent the location. Here, less seasoned hikers might choose to stop near McCrystal Creek, eat lunch and head back. More adventurous hikers will want to continue on to Ash Mountain's 11,430 foot summit. The final leg of the hike is the steepest, comprised of large boulders and fallen rocks.



STATELINE PEAK GUIDED HIKE

Ascent/Descent: 1200 feet

Drive Time: 1.5-2 hours

Skill-Level: Intermediate-Advanced

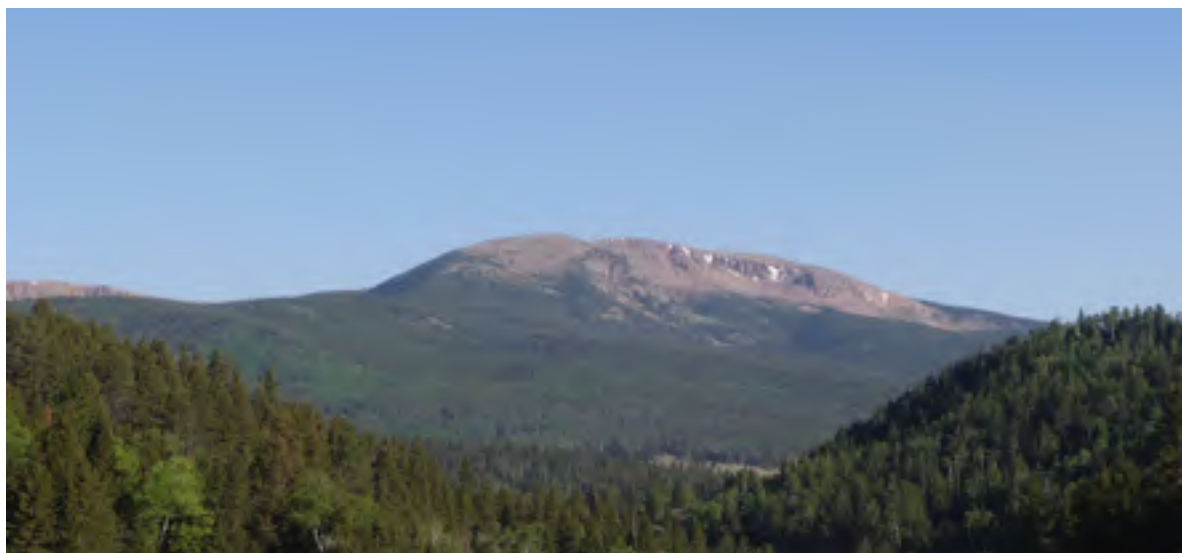

Begin with a beautiful drive to alpine Glacier Lakes at 11,600 feet. The main challenge with this high-country trail is altitude. The final ascent brings you to 12,867 feet providing incredible views into the Colorado portion of the Sangre de Cristo range.

CASIAS LAKES UTV & HIKING TOUR

Hiking Distance: 4.1 miles or 2 miles

Ascent/Descent: 1400 ft. or 300 ft.

Drive Time: 2-3 hours round trip

Hiking Time: 2-5 hours round trip

Skill-Level: Beginner - Advanced

Your day begins with a truck ride up to Costilla Lodge, where your UTV is waiting. Head deeper into the high country in a UTV while watching for wildlife and enjoying the spectacular views as you wind your way up the mountainside to the Casias lakes trailhead at about 11,600 ft. elevation.

A short hike of 1-2 miles takes you to any of the 4 crystal clear glacier lakes just in time for a lakeside picnic lunch. Be sure to notice the bristlecone pines with their unique purple pine cones.

Now you face a choice, try to catch a fish in the lakes, take a little nap, hike around the other lakes and streams, head back to the UTV, or take the Casias challenge and tackle the climb along the ridgeline over steep talus switchbacks and finally moderately inclined tundra to reach the highest point on Vermejo at 12,931 feet.

Guests hike through a forested hillside from one station to the next, and test their shooting ability from varying distances and angles and through obstacles such as trees and bushes.

Our archery guides will size and fit each guest with a proper bow, either compound or recurve, right or left-handed, and the correct size and weight, then educate guests on proper safety handling.

This course is a perfect way to spend a few hours with friends or family of all ages out in nature.

The five-stand is a great place for a first-time shooter to learn firearm safety and take a crack at hitting a flying target. It also gives experienced marksmen a place to test their skills with shots of varying difficulty levels, including a "running-rabbit," just a short drive from

headquarters. Our expert guides meet guests at the Front Desk and bring them to the range where 12, 20, and 28 gauge shotguns as well and safety glasses and hearing protection are provided.

After safety and shooting instruction, guests enjoy practicing a variety of shots with the different targets and then play a competitive game of Annie Oakley.

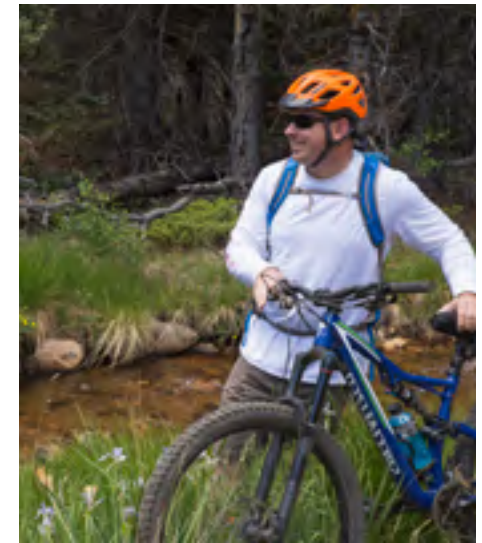

Or you can just ride around the roads near Headquarters.

Bikes may also be checked out to keep at your accommodation and ride at your leisure during your visit.





HIGH COUNTRY GUIDED MOUNTAIN BIKING TOUR

Begin the day with a scenic truck ride to a hilltop over 10,000 feet in altitude near Costilla reservoir.

Breathe in the crisp mountain air and the sights and sounds of nature as you enjoy a gentle bike ride perfect for beginners. The trail is mostly flat or slightly downhill and runs near a rippling stream flanked by piney forest and grassy fields. Take a break to soak your feet in the creek, gaze out at green rolling vistas or stretch

your legs in shaded meadows. Catch a glimpse of the elk that frequent the meadows and hillsides nearby.

At a leisurely pace, taking breaks for water, snacks and photos, the ride will last about 3 hours. When you reach Costilla Reservoir, enjoy a boxed lunch prepared by our master chefs and a couple of hours fishing or soaking in the beautiful scenery before making your way back to the lodge.

Touch the famous Catskill Kilns that were used to turn over 3000 logs a day into charcoal and learn about bustling community of homesteaders who settled here over a hundred years ago and why they left. A short hike will take you through a beautiful valley to a rarely-seen cemetery and remnants of the town of Catskill.

Vermejo's wild horses frequent this area, so keep your eyes peeled.

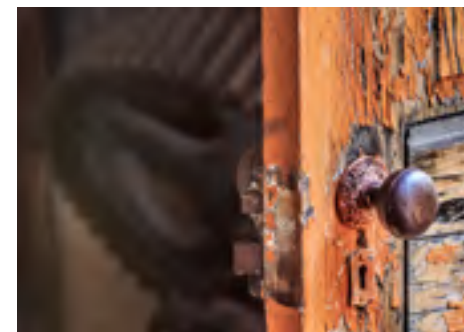
Named for Harry Koehler chairman of the Maxwell Land Grant Company Board of Directors, Koehler began as a success.

In 1906, the first coal mine was opened and the town soon claimed 1,000 residents, a post office, company store, a two-story schoolhouse and more. It grew to employ close to 400 men and boys, most working underground. There were 219 beehive coking ovens and a coal

washing plant.

Frequent strikes, the depression, and a fire that burned down the schoolhouse eventually caused the camp to close in 1924.

A visit to Koehler includes a beautiful scenic drive, with wildlife viewing en route, and time to wander through the remnants of the lives of the people who built their version of the American dream in Koehler, living in rows of company homes and toiling to produce fuel for the

When Ted Turner purchased Vermejo in 1996, his goal was to restore the land and habitats to a healthy rewilded state. The riverbanks had been overgrazed due to an overpopulation of elk and cattle.

To create healthy waterways for fish and other species like beaver, cattle were removed and riparian (riverbank) restoration projects begun. Ten half-mile exclosures were built along the Vermejo River to keep elk from overgrazing and allow vegetation to grow. This new vegetation prevents erosion, allowing for deep, cool, narrow waterways that support cool water fisheries and food for riparian species.

Don't miss the chance to see these projects in action. Witness the new growth, beaver ponds, and catch a Rio Grande Cutthroat Trout, one of the species that is now thriving on Vermejo due to this work.

Each spring, adult male elk and deer shed their old antlers and grow a new set. They are among the fastest-growing animal tissue on the planet.

With over 7,000 Rocky Mountain Elk and 3,000 Mule Deer on Vermejo, about half of them male, there are well over 7,000 new shed antlers waiting to be found each year. We only find about half of them annually so there are still thousands left over from previous years.

While spring is the time when the animals are dropping new sheds, they can be found any time of year.

Let one of our private guides lead you to the prime shed-hunting areas of Vermejo, and you might just find one of these natural treasures.

If you find a "matched set," both antlers from the same animal you'll know you've hit the jackpot!

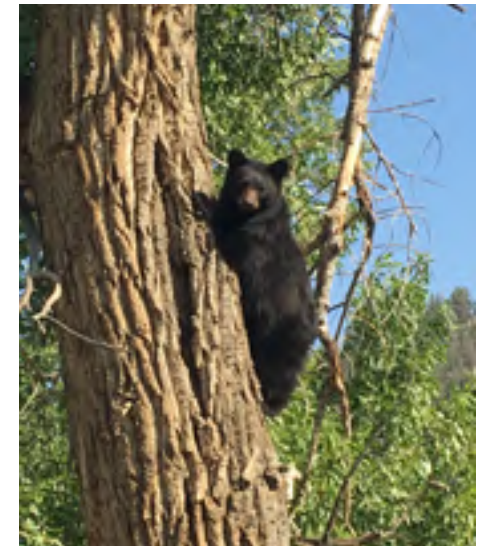

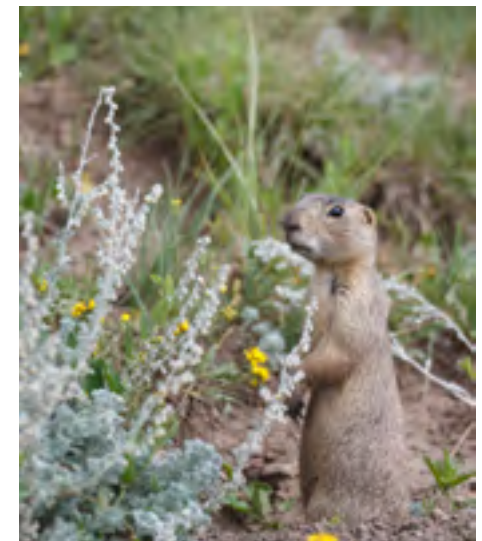

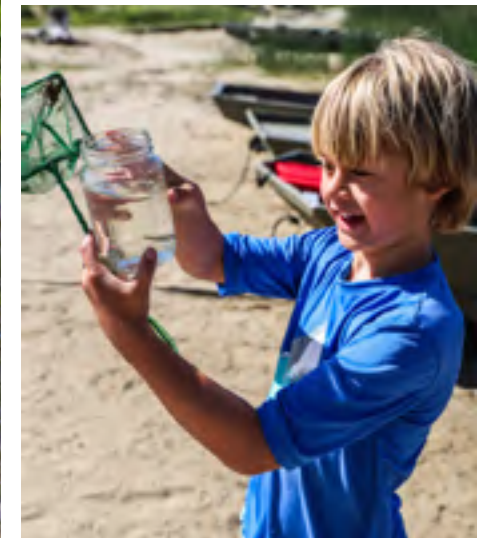

IT'S A BUG'S LIFE, KIDS FISHING TOUR
